POSITION DESCRIPTION

Under supervision of the CAIIS co-directors and assistant director, support activities including:

- Outreach and community building among American Indian and and Indigenous Studies graduate students across UW's three campuses
- Write at least six media pieces, highlighting CAIIS events, programming, and impacts.
- Organize, advertise, and host weekly Native Organization for Indigenous Scholars (NOIS) meetings on the Seattle campus
- Organize and advertise the monthly AIIS Scholars meetings
- Plan special events for NOIS, AIIS Scholars, and other relevant graduate student groups across campus
- Create venues for graduate students to mentor and build community with undergraduate students
- Help build graduate student interest, engagement and community around other CAIIS programming, especially Canoe Family
- Other event planning and administrative support as needed

REQUIREMENTS

Full-time enrolled (10-credits) UW graduate student in good standing; strong communication and interpersonal skills; interest in and/or connections with Native American and/or Indigenous community on and off campus.
